#### ACCESS TO THE BUILDING

For the safety of our students, the following access procedure will be in effect. The doors will be open only during the following times:

St. Albans Drive parking lot entrance:

7:15 A.M. to 8:00 A.M.

Van Reed Road parking lot entrance:

7:15 A.M. to 8:00 A.M.

Entrance to the school must be made by the Van Reed Road entrance. All adults visiting the building must sign in and out at the school office and receive a visitor's pass.

All parents are required to uphold the following procedures:

1. If you are bringing your child into the building for the morning session, please drop off your child at the door. It's not the appropriate time to meet with the teacher (unless previously arranged) since he/she is getting the students ready for the day.
2. Also, please remain outside at dismissal time. If you need to come inside for your child or to see a teacher, please wait until 2:45 p.m. This will help alleviate confusion since both entrances are used for dismissal.

Gymnasium entrance:

The doors at the gymnasium entrance will be open during these times for preschool students only:

10:40 A.M. to 11:00 A.M.

2:10 P.M. to 2:20 P.M.

After these times, the front (main) entrance to the school must be used.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

\* Classes will resume on Monday, August 25 (grades 2 – 8) at 8:00 A.M. for the 2008 - 2009 school term. Bus transportation will be provided. Check with your district's transportation office for bus numbers and routes.

\* Kindergarten and First Grade open house will be held on Monday, Aug. 25. Open House for 3 year old Preschool will be held on Tuesday, Aug. 26. Open House for our Pre-K classes will be held on Wednesday, Aug. 27. Please check the enclosed flyers for Preschool, Kindergarten and First Grade Open House schedule.

\* Kindergarten and First Grade will begin on Tuesday, August 26. All Day Kindergarten and First Grade will dismiss at 12:30 P.M. on Tuesday, August 26, Wednesday, August 27 and Thursday, August 28. (There is no bus transportation for 12:30 P.M. early dismissal). Please wait outside the main office entrance on these days, because lunch periods will be in progress in the cafeteria.

\* Labor Day vacation will be Friday, August 29, and Monday, September 1.

\* Class lists for student placement will be posted on the school doors the weekend of August 23 and 24. Please consult these lists for your child's homeroom (grades 2 - 8). The lists will also be on our website at [www.stignatiusvikings.org/](http://www.stignatiusvikings.org/) Click on the school page link. Please do not call the school office about placement. Preschool, Kindergarten, and First Grade students will receive a letter from his/her teacher.

\* Our opening day Mass will begin at 9:00 A.M. Parents and family members are always invited to attend.

\* All computer and registration fees must be paid before the first day of class. Students will not be admitted to class if these fees are outstanding.

\* A tuition option payment plan must be in effect for your child to begin class (see tuition).

\* Parents are to wait outside when picking up their child after school. If a child needs to leave school before the scheduled dismissal time, a note must be sent to the school office via the teacher. Parents must then report to the office to sign out their child. Your child will be called to come to the office.

\* The office phone will be available to students for emergency situations.

## **HEALTH ROOM SUMMER INFORMATION**

All Preschool and new students to our school in grades K-8 **may not begin** the upcoming school year unless current immunization records are received in the office **prior to 08/25/08**. Extra forms are available in the school office. If you need a form and cannot come to the office, please call (610-678-0111) and we will gladly mail the form to you.

In May, dental forms were distributed to Grades K, 2 and 6. Completed dental forms are needed for grades 1, 3, and 7. Physical forms were distributed to grades K and 5. Completed physical forms are needed in grades 1 and 6. Examinations performed after 08/28/07 can and will be accepted for students in grades 1 and 6 (physicals) and grades 1, 3 & 7 (dental exams). These forms are due in the school office by March 2009 .

If you do not have a family physician/pediatrician or dentist, the school physician and dentist will be available only once in the upcoming school year to perform these exams on your child. The examinations for these grades are a Pennsylvania requirement.

## **VOLUNTEER INFORMATION**

Our school is blessed by the number of parent volunteers, who help us each day. Your cooperation is requested in the following areas:

1. Dress Code – Please dress in a respectful and professional manner when helping our students. You serve as a special role model to them. Office casual would be considered appropriate.
2. Please sign-in at the office when you arrive. During your stay you are asked to display your visitor label, so you are readily identifiable to any one who sees you. Please complete your label with your first and last name and the date. When you leave, please sign out in the office.

3. All volunteers must complete the following: Diocesan Code of Conduct, Diocesan Sexual Abuse Code, Criminal background check, “Protecting God’s Children” Workshop. Information on these will be available in the school office. If you have already completed the above last year, it is not necessary to do so again. Please check with Mr. Birmingham, if you have any questions.
4. Volunteers are limited to – two at a time, per classroom under normal situations; any changes with this number need to be approved by Mr. Birmingham or Mr. John Calvaresi.

## **LUNCH/RECESS GUIDELINES**

The following guidelines are in effect.

1. Two or three lunch monitors will be needed per lunch period; first lunch at 11:00 A.M., second lunch period at 11:30 A.M., and third lunch at 12:00 P.M.
2. Parents must make arrangements in advance with the office to come and have lunch with their child. Please call the office before 9:00 A.M. to order lunch from the cafeteria.
3. Parents are requested not to bring in any fast food lunches for their children.
4. When bringing cupcakes, ice cream, etc., please be sure it is enough for the entire class.

- \* For 8:00 A.M. drop off and 2:30 P.M. pickup, please use the St. Albans Drive parking lot. For morning session pickup at 11:00 A.M., please use the Van Reed parking lot and remain outside for dismissal.
- \* *Parking spaces outside the gym entrance are available for Preschool only.*
- \* “On Tuesday, August 26, Wednesday, August 27 and Thursday, August 28, All Day Kindergarten students will be dismissed at 12:30 P.M. (There is no bus transportation at this time of day.)
- \* Students may wear play clothes and sturdy shoes (sneakers, tie shoes, shoes with velcro) for class.
- \* Please report absentees to office by 8:15 A.M.
- \* A daily snack will be provided.

## **EXTENDED CARE INFORMATION**

- \* On August 25, our after school Extended Care program will begin for those who are registered.
- \* Students who are enrolled in this program will be dismissed to the kindergarten rooms at 2:35 P.M. At this time students may change into play clothes if desired. The after school program will consist of a snack, recreational period, arts & crafts, activities and time to do homework. Extended care will be available on days that school is in session. Parents are to come into the classroom to pick up their child. Please use the gymnasium entrance.
- \* Payments for the Extended Care programs are due the first day of class each week. Please make checks payable to *St. Ignatius Loyola Parish*. We require that you pay for each day that your child is enrolled regardless of any absences.
- \* Please notify your child’s teacher and the school office if your child’s schedule changes.

If anyone is interested in the Extended Care Program for the fall, please stop by the office for forms or information. New forms need to be completed each year. Registration fee is \$35 per child per year. Please register before school begins.

## **ABSENTEE POLICY (Kindergarten - 8)**

When a child is absent, please notify the school by calling (610) 678-0111 **before 8:15 A.M.** This procedure has been established specifically for your child’s protection. An answering machine is available at all times to take messages.

On the child’s return to school, a note stating the reasons for the absence must be presented to the teacher. Please return this form as soon as possible. You can also fax (610-670-5795) an absentee note.

## **POLICY FOR FIELD TRIPS**

The purpose of field trips is for the educational advancement of students. Each class is permitted two (2) field trips per year (this does not include administration-planned trips such as concerts at the Sovereign Performing Arts Center or bonding activities with Holy Name High School.)

Field trips are planned so a child will derive the maximum educational value from them. The teacher plans these trips after consultation with the principal. Field trips are not optional since they are planned to take the place of the structured school day. Students are responsible for the cost of these trips. Bus transportation is the preferred mode of transportation. In the event cars are used, car insurance information must be on file in the school office.

The number of chaperones is dependent on the discretion of the teacher and the security needs of the students (based on the age of the students and the location of the trip). There is to be only one chaperone per family. If the number of interested chaperones is greater than the needed number of chaperones, these names will be picked by lot. In most situations, the ratio of students to adult will not exceed 4:1. Since chaperones will be asked to be responsible for a certain number of students, siblings are not allowed to attend.

All chaperones must complete the following items before the scheduled trip:

-Read and Sign the Diocesan Child Abuse Policy

- Read and Sign the Diocesan Policy on Sexual Abuse
- Complete and receive a criminal background check.
- Attend a "Protecting God's Children" workshop

A student can be excluded from a field trip due to behavioral issues. The administration and teacher maintain the right to cancel any field trip due to violation of this policy.

## **GIFTED PROGRAM**

Any student who attends educational programs outside of our school must wear their school uniform. The students are representatives of our school and should be proud of who they are.

## **READING LISTS**

## **HAIRCUTS (Grades 1 – 8)**

### **Adhere to the following rules:**

Parents are asked to please monitor haircuts in this regard.

**Boys:** No fad hairstyles. Haircuts are to be neat and trimmed properly. Hair is not to go beyond the shirt collar, below the ear or touch the eyebrow. For the junior high level, no facial hair is allowed.

**Girls:** No fad hairstyles. Braids are allowed. No bandanas are allowed. All hair must be natural looking. When questions arise, administration will have final say in determining accordance with policy.

## **BODY PIERCING/TATTOOS**

Any type of body piercing such as eye brow, lip, tongue, belly button, boy's ears, etc., is not allowed. Girls are allowed to have pierced ears, but only in the ear lobe, not around the entire ear. One set of earrings is allowed for girls. Please keep to small, stud-type earrings, since large hoops, etc. can present a safety hazard.

Tattoos are not permitted.

## **LATENESS**

It is imperative that a child be here on time in order to prepare for the day. All students should be in their seats and prepared for the day by 7:55 A.M. When a child arrives after the 8:00 A.M. bell, he or she must be signed in at the office by the parent. The child will be given a LATE slip to

enter class. After an accumulation of three late slips, disciplinary action will be taken.

## **SCHOOL PHOTOS**

The school photographers will be at our school for individual photos on Monday, September 8 for grades Pre-K and Kindergarten through grade 8. On Tuesday, September 9 individual photos will be taken for preschool three year olds.

Please dress appropriately; no T-shirts, tank or crop tops, jeans, shorts, etc.

## **SCHOOL SAFETY**

During the school year all parents, visitors, and volunteers to the school building must report to the school office to sign in and receive a visitor's pass. On leaving the building, the person must sign out in the office.

## **STUDENT HANDBOOKS**

2008 - 2009 information regarding all school policies and curriculum will be distributed to parents on "Meet the Teacher Night", Tuesday, September 9 at 7:00 P.M. in the auditorium for Kindergarten to grade 5, if not previously scheduled for another night by the individual teacher, and on Wednesday, September 10 at 7:00 P.M. for grades 6 to 8. Please make arrangements to attend. The meeting will last approximately two hours.

## **SUPERVISION**

No students may arrive before 7:30 A.M. unless by bus.

Students who arrive before 7:30 A.M. are asked to wait at a table in the auditorium.

After school, students must be either enrolled in our after school extended care program or under supervision of a teacher or an adult. A student is **not allowed** to wait for a practice to start without supervision. Students staying for C.Y.O. activities must make arrangements through the coach, not their teacher.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

Bus schedules regarding pick-up times for your child will be issued through the public school district in which you reside. Some districts publish this information on cable TV. If in doubt, call your district's transportation office for bus numbers and pick-up times, our school office does not have this information.

Car riders need to be picked up by 2:45 P.M. If a child is not picked up by that time, he/she will be

sent back to a designated classroom. The parent must then come into the office to have them paged.

## **DISCIPLINE CODE OF CONDUCT**

In an effort to re-emphasize Christian values, the following Discipline Code of Conduct has been instituted.

1. To maintain a respectful silent composure in church, to genuflect with reverence, and to actively participate in the liturgical service always being mindful that it is the House of God.
2. To pray with reverence at all times whenever prayers are being recited. To use God's name in prayer and in respectful ways at all times.
3. To handle all religious items, i.e. the Bible, with respect and reverence.
4. To show respect for our country and those who have given their lives for our country by properly and respectfully Pledging Allegiance and singing our National Anthem.
5. To respect and obey all authority figures and rules, regulations, and policies of the school community.
6. To speak with dignity and respect when conversing with each other (avoid name calling, teasing, innuendos).
7. To respect the individuality of all people. This includes appearance, character, ethnicity, social status, and abilities.
8. To show respect for school and personal property by taking proper care of all items.
9. To show respect for human sexuality in language, dress, artistic work, and music.
10. To demonstrate integrity and honesty in all aspects of human life.

Students will be given two copies of the Discipline Code of Conduct. The student and parents are required to sign one form and return it to the homeroom teacher. Please retain the other copy for your files.

### **Demerits and Detentions**

A student will receive one demerit for any minor violation of the Discipline Code of Conduct. If a student accumulates three demerits, a detention will be given. Parents will be notified in writing about the demerit and detention. A major violation to the Discipline Code of Conduct will result in an immediate detention. A form will be sent home for the parent's signature.

The procedure for serving detentions for behavior problems or other school violations will be as follows.

1. When any type of discipline problem begins, parents will be notified immediately by the teacher, either by phone or in writing with a detention form.
2. The student is required to stay after school on the day assigned. Grades K – 3 (2:45 P.M. to 3:15 P.M.), Grades 4 – 8 (2:45 P.M. to 3:45 P.M.). Failure to stay will result in the issuance of a second detention.
3. If the situation for which the detention was issued does not improve, a conference will be held with the principal, teacher, parents and student. At this conference, steps will be discussed to prevent a reoccurrence.
4. Behavioral detentions are cumulative throughout the school year and will affect the conduct grade on the report card.

## **TUITION**

Tuition for the 2008 - 2009 school term is being collected through the following options:

- Option 1 Grades K – 8: annual payment (total amount) due June 1.
- Option 2 Grades K – 8: semester payments (one half of total amount) due June 1 and December 1.
- Option 3 Grades K – 8: twelve monthly payments through the **FACTS** Management Company, June through May.
- Option 4 Preschool: annual payment (total amount) due June 1.
- Option 5 Preschool: semester payment (one half of total amount) due June 1 and December 1.
- Option 6 Preschool: ten monthly payments through the **FACTS** Management Company, August through May.

One of the above plans must be in effect for a student to start class in August. Options 3 and 6 involve a \$38 yearly fee with **FACTS**. (The maximum fee per family is \$38.)

## **VACATION POLICY**

A temporary absence policy has been established. The form needs to be filled out and turned in to the office at least one week before the absence occurs. Please refer to the form in the handbook.

## CAFETERIA NEWS

With the ongoing concern of fat content in our food and the continuation of BMI testing, we will continue offer many of the items introduced last year such as skim milk, 1% milk, lo-fat chocolate milk and Icy Tea Lite.

Salads will be available daily, made with reduced calorie dressing.

We will offer peach bowls, mixed fruit bowls and pudding.

As always, we bake our foods, not fry them.

As new food items become available, we will offer them to the students.

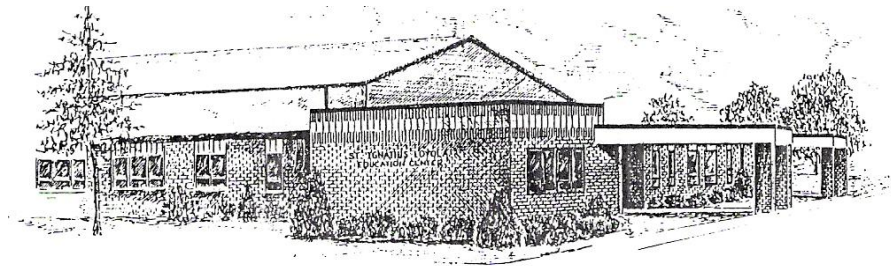
