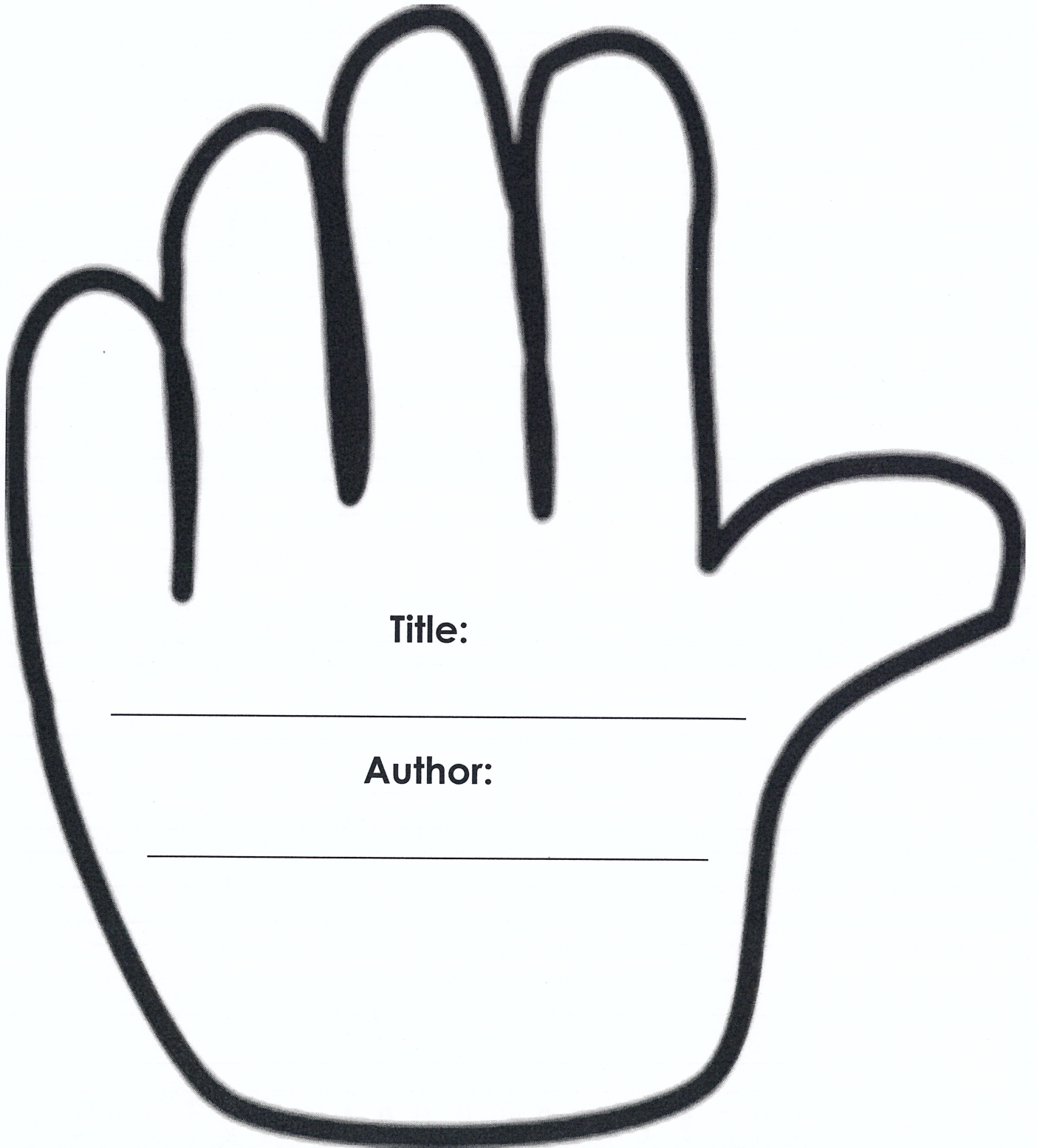
Give the Book a Hand!

Draw and illustrate events from the book in and around the hand.

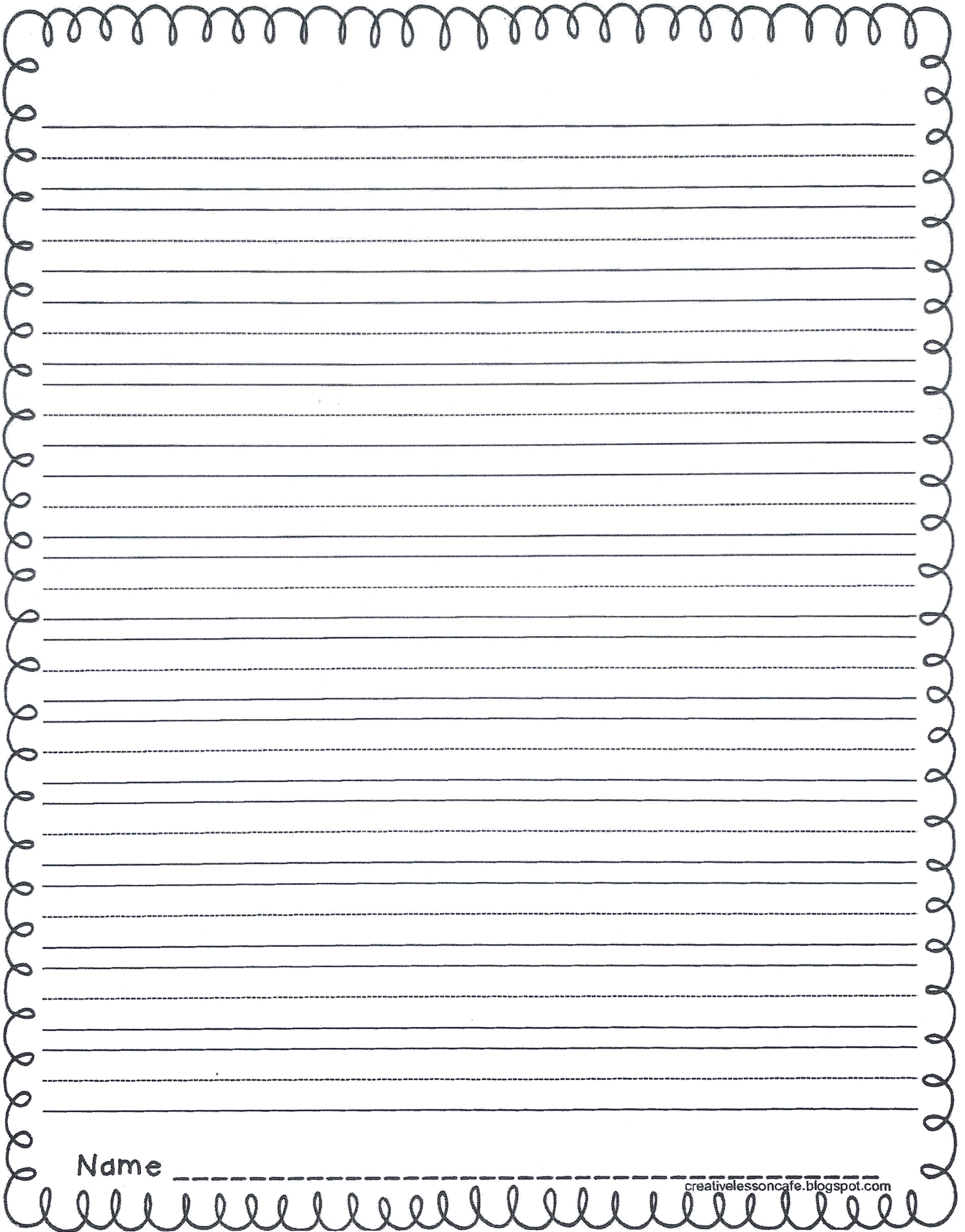
On the next page, write **5** sentences about something that happened in the book.
